### COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Guide: 2020-2021 School Year

Rockbridge Academy is a K-12 private school of approximately 330 students currently located on two campuses. The Grammar School (K-6) operates at 608 Evergreen Rd. in Crownsville while the Upper School (7-12) operates at 911 Generals Hwy, Millersville.

The following COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Guide defines *precaution levels* and *prevention protocols* for the coming school year. Precautions and protocols were created referencing recommendations from the federal, state, and local government and best practices shared among private schools. Rockbridge Academy is committed to instruction that is seamless and effective regardless of whether it is delivered in person or remotely. We would like to acknowledge the ongoing contributions of Rockbridge Academy faculty, staff, parents, and health professionals in our community, resulting in this and future refinements to our community's response to this pandemic.

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# **PRECAUTION LEVELS**

Color designations signal precautionary actions appropriate to the level of COVID risk present. State and local risk levels and tools such as <u>Harvard Global Health Institute (HGHI) local risk tracking tool</u> will be consulted.

**GREEN**: *Low Risk*, normal level of activity on campus, with prevention protocols only as needed. This level will likely coincide with HGHI code green or overall Maryland Phase 3.

**YELLOW**: *Moderate risk* with necessary prevention protocols. Likely coincides with HGHI code yellow or orange or with Maryland Phase 1 or 2.

**ORANGE**: *Increased risk* with necessary prevention protocols. Likely coincides with HGHI code orange, with Maryland Phase 1 or 2, or increased local concern.



**RED**: *High risk* necessitates school closure for any duration. Likely coincides with State shelter-in-place orders, HGHI code red, or in the event of staff or student COVID-19 diagnosis.







NOTE: Descriptions above are general. The Administration will set the Precaution Level after weighing all circumstances contributing to safety and practicality. Individual classrooms or the respective campuses may be required to adhere to more restrictive precautions based on the circumstances.


#### Decision Aid: Exclusion and Return for Laboratory Confirmed COVID-19 Cases and Persons with COVID-19-like Illness in Schools, Child Care Programs, and Youth Camps

For the purposes of this decision aid, COVID-19-like illness is defined as: New onset cough or shortness of breath OR At least 2 of the following: fever of 100.4° or higher, chills, shivering, muscle pain, sore throat, headache, loss of sense of taste or smell, and gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting or diarrhea). NOTE: This definition was adapted from the clinical criteria in the <u>CDC case definition of a probable case of COVID-19</u>.

Person (child, care provider, educator, other staff) with **ONE NEW** symptom not meeting the definition of COVID-19-like illness.



Exclude person and allow return when symptoms have improved and criteria in the <u>Communicable Diseases Summary</u> have been met as applicable. If person develops symptoms of COVID-19-like illness, follow processes below for person with COVID-19-like illness.


Significant Exposure means close contact (less than 6 feet, masked or

<u>contact</u> (less than 6 feet, masked or not) with an individual for <u>more than</u> <u>15 minutes</u>.

YES? Go to steps 2 & 3. NO? No action needed.



I was exposed to someone who was exposed to a person with suspected<sup>2</sup> or confirmed diagnosis. Exposures were significant.



### 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Exposure?

2 A suspected case is a situation where the individual has not tested positive but is being tested or has been directed to self-quarantine based on symptoms.

### **Notification Procedures for Confirmed Cases of COVID-19**

- Internal tracking and management of COVID-19 self-assessments and cases will be the responsibility of the school's health officer through the tracking and notification system *School Pass®*, attendance records, and information collected from the community.
- Parents are expected to disclose confirmed cases within the family to the school immediately through the health officer.
- In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19 for student, teacher, or staff, the following steps will be initiated:
  - 1. Immediate quarantine of 1<sup>st</sup> degree contacts. This could require quarantine of just a student cohort, the entirety of one of the school campuses, or the entire school itself.
  - 2. The local health department will be contacted.
  - 3. The school will work with the local health department to identify persons who may have had close contact with the person testing positive for COVID-19.
  - 4. Written notification will be sent to all identified contacts. This notification will include:
    - ✓ When to seek medical care
    - ✓ How to monitor for symptoms
    - ✓ Who to contact and how to contact them if they develop symptoms of COVID-19 while under quarantine
    - ✓ The projected length of quarantine if they remain asymptomatic
    - Plan for maintaining remote learning for those who remain well enough to engage in learning while under quarantine
    - ✓ Information about local COVID-19 sites.
- For second degree exposures within a classroom cohort or on a particular campus, the school administration will notify families within the cohort or within the respective campus while maintaining confidentiality.

## Isolation, Exclusion, Quarantine and Return to School Plan

If a student or school staff member develops symptoms of COVID-19-like illness during the school day, RA staff will:

- 1. Safely isolate the person in the designated isolation area and place a surgical mask on the person if they are not wearing a cloth face covering as appropriate.
- 2. The RA staff member will don the appropriate PPE and conduct the appropriate determination of the student's condition based on presenting symptoms.
- 3. Begin the process for the person to vacate the school as soon as possible.
- 4. When Rockbridge Academy is informed of a laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19 in a student or school staff member, regardless of whether the person has symptoms, the school will begin the process for identifying close contacts and begin the notification process in collaboration with the local health department.
- 5. Rockbridge Academy will follow the decision trees in this manual regarding quarantine, exclusion, and return to school protocols for close contact and confirmed COVID-19 cases.
- 6. If the number of laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 or persons with COVID-19- like illness meets the definition of an outbreak, the response decisions, including possible school closure, will be made by the local health department.
